

TRAVEL TO WEST DOWNS CENTRE

At the University of Winchester we're passionate about our local environment, so we encourage our students, staff and visitors to travel as sustainably as possible when coming to campus. The SBN event is being held in the award-winning West Downs Centre, the postcode for which is SO22 5FT, and the information below outlines the variety of transport options available for your journey.

Walking – For those living within walking distance, the West Downs Centre is located on the University's West Downs Quarter on Romsey Road.

Cycling – Covered cycle parking is available next to The Pantry packaging free shop. This is accessed by the path leading round to the left-hand side of the circular auditorium (level path from pedestrian crossing). If showers are required, these can be found in the toilets at the east end of the building on floors 2, 3 and 4 of the West Downs Centre. Please check in with reception who will be able to direct you.

Train – The West Downs Centre is located approximately 1 mile (15 to 20-minute walk / 5 to 10-minute cycle) from Winchester Rail Station, making the train a convenient option for travelling to the event. These links provide suggested routes for [walking](#) or [cycling](#) from the station.

Bus – Bluestar and Stagecoach both run bus services with stops close to the University. If you're travelling from Southampton, [Bluestar Route 1](#) stops on Southgate Street and a suggested walking route to the West Downs Centre can be found [here](#). Stagecoach services into the city are shown on [this map](#), the timetables for which can be found [here](#).

Park and Ride – There are four P&R car parks located on the outskirts of the city: South Winchester, located just off J11 of the M3; Pitt, on the Romsey Road; and St Catherine's and Barfield, which are both located to the east, off J10 of the M3. The [Park and Ride website](#) has more details, including the bus timetable. Up to 6 passengers can travel on one P&R ticket making it even better value if you for car share. The bus stop for the University is the Royal Hampshire County Hospital, and the WDC is 200 yards up the road on the right hand side.



Accessible Parking – Parking on campus is extremely limited but we do have a small amount of spaces available for those that are unable to use the Park and Ride. Please just let your contact know your registration number so that we can book you in.
